- 3 Advice and assistance in relation to a 'special reasons' hearing
- 4 Assistance in relation to lodging notice of appeal against sentence or conducting an appeal

The key stages of your matter (based on the assumptions that you have entered a guilty plea and that the matter is resolved at one hearing)

- 1 You will meet with your solicitor to provide instructions on what occurred
